# Safe Return to In-Person Instruction Plan

In order to ensure the health and safety of our students, our employees, and their families during the 2021-22 school year, the Breathitt County School District will adhere to guidelines set forth by the local health department, CDC, the Governor's office and the Kentucky Department of Education.

**Students benefit from in-person learning, and safely returning to in-person instruction is a priority. First day for students will be August 11, 2021.**

The following procedures will be put into place to ensure the health and safety of our students, staff, and community:

- **SAFETY**

- All students, teachers, staff, and household members 12 years and older are encouraged to get a COVID-19 vaccination.
- Students, teachers, staff who have a fever and/or symptoms of COVID-19 should remain at home.
- Air purification systems are in place in all schools and classrooms.
- Masks must be worn while students are on the bus.
- Masks are required for all persons while indoors in all classroom and non-classroom settings, unless otherwise exempted (e.g., cannot wear a mask due to disability), regardless of COVID-19 vaccination status if the county is in the orange or red incidence rates. Masks are recommended if the county is in the green or yellow incidence rate.
- Masks are not required while outdoors.
- Visitors to school facilities will be required to wear a mask while indoors.
- Temperature checks of unvaccinated students and staff will be conducted on a weekly basis if the county is in the yellow, orange, or red incidence rates.
- While in classrooms, students will be seated 3 feet apart when possible.
- Each school will follow procedures for cleaning and disinfecting the facility regularly.
- Hand sanitizer will be readily available in all school facilities.
- The schools and district will continue to work with the local health department to facilitate case investigation and contact tracing.

**Due to the changing nature of COVID-19, it is possible that current plans related to a resurgence in cases may change.** Updates will be provided throughout the year via our district webpage, district Facebook page, e-mail, and the IC Messenger calling service. If you have not updated your contact information at your child's school, please do so at your earliest convenience so that we can ensure that you receive the most current information.

## Continuity of Services Plan

In the event of a resurgence of COVID-19 cases during the 2021-22 school year, the Breathitt County School District will adhere to guidelines set forth by the local health department, CDC, the Governor's office and the Kentucky Department of Education.

In the event of a resurgence of COVID-19 cases that impact school in Breathitt County, the following procedures will be put into place to ensure the health and safety of our students, staff, and community:

- **SAFETY**

- All students, teachers, staff, and household members 12 years and older are encouraged to get a COVID-19 vaccination.
- Students, teachers, staff who have a fever and/or symptoms of COVID-19 should remain at home.
- Air purification systems are in place in all schools and classrooms.
- Masks must be worn while students are on the bus.
- Masks are required for all persons while indoors in all classroom and non-classroom settings, unless otherwise exempted (e.g., cannot wear a mask due to disability), regardless of COVID-19 vaccination status if the county is in the orange or red incidence rates. Masks are recommended if the county is in the green or yellow incidence rate.
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- While in classrooms, students will be seated 3 feet apart when possible.
- Each school will follow procedures for cleaning and disinfecting the facility regularly.
- Hand sanitizer will be readily available in all school facilities.
- The schools and district will continue to work with the local health department to facilitate case investigation and contact tracing.

- **INSTRUCTION**

- In the event that a resurgence of COVID-19 cases results in intermittent school closure, all students will participate in virtual learning that is based on a synchronous school day. Students will attend all classes using the Google Classroom and Google Meet platforms during intermittent school closures.
- In the event that a resurgence of COVID-19 cases results in reduced capacity at the schools, students and families will have the following options:
  - **Virtual Learning Academy option** utilizing evidence-based digital programs. Students will receive online support from teachers with the virtual learning academy option.
  - **Hybrid option** that includes both in-person instruction and online learning days. Groups of students would be scheduled to attend in-person classes on a rotating schedule that will be provided prior to the first day of school. On days when students do not attend in-person classes, they will complete work online that is supported by the teacher.

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
